## **Brighter Holiday Project: Supporting Families Facing Hardship**

In December, 2024, the Brighter Holiday Project provided critical support to 17 families, including 49 children, who were navigating significant financial struggles. Many of these families were facing difficult circumstances, such as single parents raising children on their own, parents with disabilities, and those escaping domestic abuse and starting fresh in a new area. Some parents were working multiple jobs to make ends meet, while others had recently lost their jobs and were unsure how they would provide for their families.

For these families, putting food on the table and paying bills often meant that holiday gifts weren't even an option. Many were unable to provide presents for their children, and without the support of this program, there would have been no gifts under the tree. This year's Brighter Holiday Project ensured that all children under 18 received gifts—thoughtful presents tailored to their hobbies and interests—along with warm clothing and a holiday meal, including extra food for the holiday break.

The program's ability to provide not just gifts but also food and clothing helped bring a sense of joy and relief to families who had been struggling, making the holiday season just a little brighter for those who needed it most.
